Reciprocity of Concealed Carry Permits

The State of Alabama recognizes any concealed carry permit issued by any other state. ALA. CODE § 13A-11-85(a) (2015). In furtherance of the requirements of section 13A-11-85(b) of the Code of Alabama, the following is a list of states which recognize concealed carry permits issued pursuant to section 13A-11-75 of the Code. States that conditionally recognize an Alabama concealed carry permit (if the permittee is over the age of 21, etc.) are not included.
